Solving Problems and Making Change Agreements

- 1.) Focus on solutions
- 2.) Brainstorm don't edit; be creative
- 3.) Behavior change includes mutuality and compromise
- 4.) Reaching agreement = combining solutions
 - a) very specific
 - b) spelled out in clear, descriptive behavioral terms
 - c) includes cues to remind
 - d) usually in writing
